

# Washington Department of Ecology Issues Full Oil Spill Contingency Plan Approval to NRC

### For Immediate Release

**Olympia, WA & Great River, NY** – The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) and NRC jointly announced that WDOE has issued full approval to NRC’s Washington State oil spill contingency plan.

ECOLOGY issued its five-year approval through December 27, 2018 pursuant to Washington State Administrative Code Section 173-182. Although approved for vessel coverage commencing November 1, 2013, with the close of the final 30-day public comment period, the NRC Washington Plan has now been issued its formal approval letter by ECOLOGY.

Steve Candito, NRC CEO commented, “NRC is pleased to be the first and currently the only fully approved Primary Response Contractor and Plan Holder pursuant to ECOLOGY’s most recent regulations. We thank ECOLOGY and its personnel for their diligence during the plan review process. NRC is particularly proud of its ability to meet ECOLOGY’s very stringent requirements in all geographic areas including Grays Harbor.”
